

Shipping of Your Artwork

For artists participating in our shows who wish to send their work by mail or courier service, we recommend that you opt for transportation by ground, as there is a great cost difference with air transportation. There exist many companies who offer the services, including Canada Post.

Artists who must ship by air can opt to send their work with a mat, a board for backing (such as foam core) and a sheet of Glassine. In this case, PSEC offers to supply a frame for the duration of the exhibition (simple wood frame and regular glass). The mat must fit the standard frame size supplied by PSEC.

Should a buyer want to acquire the work with the loaned frame, PSEC will deduct the cost of the frame from the revenue of the sale.

Brokage fees

Packages arriving at customs can sometimes be subject to brokerage fees. Should PSEC have to cover these fees for the package to clear customs, the artist shall undertake the necessary steps to obtain the reimbursement. PSEC suggests that you inquire information from the courier company concerning these fees.

Make sure that the exterior dimension of the mat is equivalent to the dimension of the

13 X 15, 15 X 17, 17 X 19, 19 X 23, 21 X 25, 23 X 29, 25 X 29, 29 X 35, 35 X 41

N.B. PSEC takes into account a 2 ½ “mat . For example, the 13” X 15” frame would be suitable for an 8” X 10” work. You may choose the size you think will be best.
